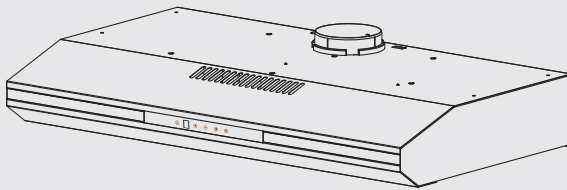

SAFETY WARNINGS

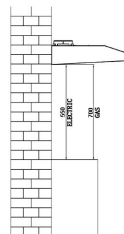
Please read this user manual thoroughly before attempting to use this appliance for the first time. This manual contains important information concerning your personal safety as well as use and care of the appliance.

Unpacking

- Do not use the appliance if there are obvious signs of transportation damage.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or qualified technical personnel in order to avoid a hazard.
- Please ensure that young children do not play with the plastic bag packaging.

For the Installer

- The extractor hood can be installed over any gas and electric cooktop. Minimum installation height from the bench top to the bottom of the hood is 700mm (gas range) and 550mm (electric range). (Fig. 1).

- Always mount the extractor hood over the center of the hob.
- Ensure that the appliance is installed in a location with good permanent ventilation.
- When making the electrical connections, check that the mains voltage and frequency corresponds to the technical information shown on the rating plate.
- Electrical connection must be made in accordance to local standards only. Check that the voltage in your area is correct before plugging in.
- Use an electrical connector with earth that is correct for your location. The electrical connection of this appliance must be connected to earth (where applicable):
 - Green & Yellow = EARTH;
 - Blue = NEUTRAL;
 - Brown = LIVE
- Ducted mode:
 - Connect the extractor hood to the exhaust duct through a pipe of minimum diameter 120mm. For the most efficient air flow exhaust, use the shortest and straightest duct route possible.
 - Do not connect the extractor hood to exhaust ducts carrying combustion fumes.
 - If the extractor hood is used in conjunction with non-electrical appliances (e. g. gas burning appliances), a sufficient degree of aeration must be allowed in the room to prevent the backflow of exhaust gas. The kitchen must have an opening communicating directly with the open air in order to allow entry of clean air.

Note: The manufacturer accepts no responsibility for complaints attributed to the design and layout of the pipework.

For the User

- The extractor hood is designed for domestic use to eliminate unpleasant odours from the kitchen. Do not use the hood for other uses than its specific purpose.
- Do not allow young children to play with or operate the appliance. Supervise its use by the elderly or infirm.
- Installation and repair should be attempted by qualified technical personnel only.
- It is dangerous to modify any part of this appliance. Tampering with electrical connections or mechanical parts can cause operation faults and may put the user at risk.
- Never leave high naked flames under the extractor hood when it is in operation. Always cover lit burners with cookware.
- Do not flambé or grill with an open flame directly under the extractor hood. Flames could be drawn up into the hood by the suction and the grease filters may catch fire.
- Monitor cooking continuously as overheated oil increases the risk of self-ignition.
- Do not operate the extractor hood without a grease filter.
- Always disconnect the unit from the power supply before carrying out any cleaning or maintenance work on the hood, including replacement of light bulbs to avoid the possibility of electric shock.
- Do replace defective bulbs immediately to prevent the remaining bulbs from overloading.
- It is important to clean and/or replace the filters at appropriate intervals. Grease deposits build-up increases the risk of fire.
- Ensure that the power supply chord is free from any heat source or sharp objects.
- Multiple plugs and extension cables must not be used. Overloading is dangerous and may cause a fire.

Disposal

- ▶ This appliance and its packaging are environmentally friendly and recyclable.
- ▶ Please help us to care for the environment by disposing the packaging in a proper manner and recycling any old appliances.
- ▶ Before disposing an old appliance, disconnect it from the power supply and remove the power cord to prevent hazards.

Note: The manufacturer will not be held liable for any damages resulting from improper installation nor failure to adopt proper safety measures during installation and operational use of the appliance.

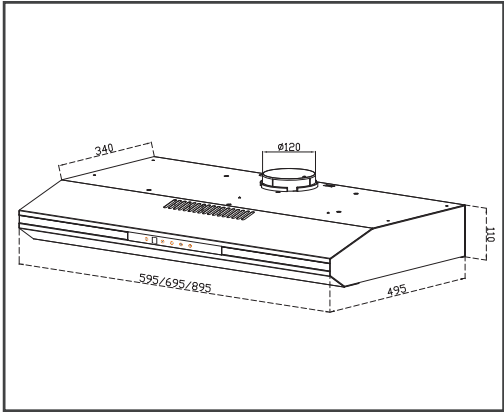

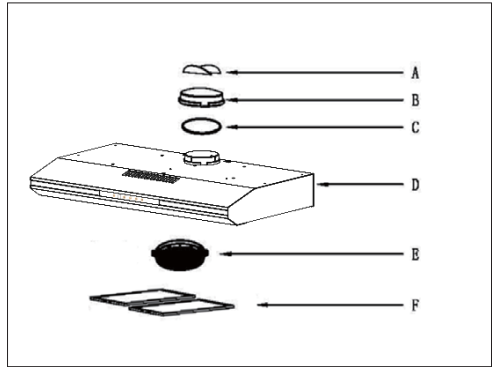

INSTALLATION

This appliance can be installed in ducted or recirculation mode.

Ducted Mode (Fig. 4)

- ▶ In ducted mode, the extractor hood fan extracts the cooking vapours and passes them through the grease filter. The air then flows to the outside.
- ▶ The grease filter absorbs the solid particles in the cooking vapours.
- ▶ In this mode, **only grease filters are installed (charcoal filter is optional)**.

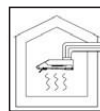

Recirculation Mode (Fig. 5)

- ▶ In recirculation mode, the extractor hood fan extracts the cooking vapours which are purified in the grease filter and charcoal filter.
- ▶ The purified air is then recirculated into the kitchen via a vent opening in the hood.
- ▶ The grease filter absorbs the solid particles in the cooking vapours.
- ▶ The charcoal filter is designed to absorb cooking odour.
- ▶ In this mode, **both grease filters and charcoal filters are installed**.

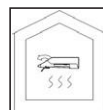

Connection to Exhaust Air Pipe (Fig. 6)

- ▶ Use Ø120mm pipe and fix it with a pipe - tightening ring (not provided) at the outlet connector.
- ▶ Connect the pipe to the outdoor duct.
- ▶ Remove charcoal filters and use only grease filter for more powerful suction.

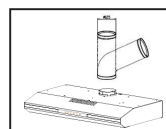

Operating mode setting (Fig. 6 & Fig. 7 & Fig. 7. 1)

Please set the operating mode of your appliance before installation. Note: Factory setting is recirculation mode.

- ▶ Remove grease filter.
- ▶ For ducted mode, slide the lever to position as shown (Fig. 7).
- ▶ Top vented : fit outlet connector and use Ø120mm pipe (Fig. 6). Note: Application pipe is not provided.
- ▶ For **recirculation mode**, install outlet cover, slide the lever to position as shown (Fig. 7. 1). Note: grease filter and charcoal filter are used.
- ▶ Refit grease filter.

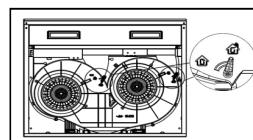

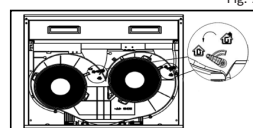

Wall mounting (Fig. 8)

Do ensure that the appliance is mounted on a solid surface which could withstand the appliance's weight.

- ▶ Determine where the extractor hood should be positioned and lightly mark where the lower edge of the appliance should be on the wall. Determine where the middle should be based on the hob.
- ▶ Place the template against the line drawn on the wall and tape it in place. Mark where the screws should be inserted.
- ▶ Drill 8mm diameter holes to a depth of 40mm for fastening the appliances, remove the template and press in the wall plugs flush with the wall.
- ▶ Insert screws to hole 1, leave approximately 1cm gap from wall surface (Fig. 8. B).
- ▶ Mount the appliance onto the wall and do ensure that it is properly engaged with the mounting screws 1 (Fig. 8).
- ▶ Tighten the screw firmly after realignment.

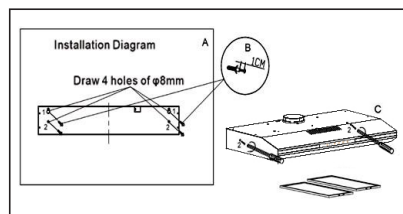

INSTALLATION

Fitting in to top cabinet (Fig. 9)

- ▶ Place the template against the line drawn on the top cabinet and tape it in place.
Mark where the screws should be inserted.
- ▶ For ducted mode, cut a minimum of Ø140mm hole on cabinet base. (Fig. 9).
- ▶ Tighten 4pcs ST 4 * 25 screws firmly to cabinet.

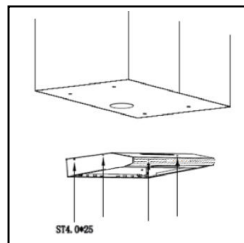


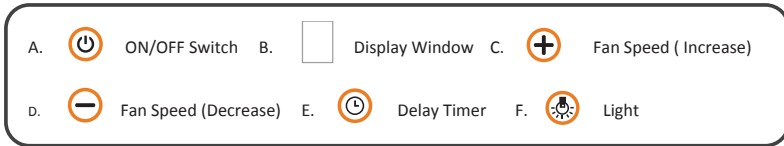

OPERATION

Note: Touch the sensor buttons gently to operate this appliance.

To achieve better air extraction, it is advisable to switch on the blower a few minutes before starting to cook and leave it on for approximately 15 minutes after cooking (or at least all cooking smell is completely removed).



1. When powering up the hood, the orange ring standby icon will light up.
2. Press to select ON / OFF, the power on icon and the rest of the operation icons will light up.
3. Touch to increase the fan speed 1 - 2 - 3.
4. Touch to decrease the fan speed 3 - 2 - 1.
5. Touch to select ON / OFF.
6. Delay stop timer:
 - a. Press Fan Speed 1, then press timer icon. Speed 1 will blink for 5 seconds and follow by timer icon blink.
 - b. Press the Delay Stop Timer icon to select the require stop timing.
(Indication of "1" = 5 mins, "2" = 10 mins, "3" = 15 mins, "4" = 20 mins)
 - c. After the delay time reach, it will automatically jump to the motor speed display.

To exit the delay function, press the speed button to 0. The delay stop function will exit after 5 seconds.
7. Clean and Fresh Function: After power on, press and hold the delay stop timer icon for 3 seconds. You will hear a beep sound. The Function will start after the beep sound. After 5 seconds, all lights will turn off. The timer and the ON/ OFF icon will indicate with an orange ring backlight. To disable, press the ON/OFF icons. All function icons will light up. Press the timer icon to disable.
8. When the cooker hood has been operated for 90 hours, and orange dot indicator will blink at the bottom right of the display window. This indicator is to remind you to clean grease filters. To cancel the reminder, press and hold the Delay Timer button for 5 seconds, and the operation hours will reset to 0.
9. When the cooker hood has been operated for 270 hours, an orange dot indicator will light up solidly at the bottom right of the display window. This indicator is to remind you to change a charcoal filters. To cancel the reminder, press and hold the Delay Timer button for 5 seconds, and the operation hours will reset to 0.

MAINTENANCE AND CARE

Before carrying out any cleaning or maintenance activities, ensure that the appliance is disconnected from the main power supply.

It is important to clean and/or replace the filters at appropriate intervals as grease deposits build-up increases the risk of fire.

Grease Filter (Fig. 10)

- ▶ Grease filters are used to absorb the grease particles formed during cooking process. Do not operate the extractor hood without a grease filter.
- ▶ The filters must be removed and cleaned every time you see the orange indicator blink on the control panel display window or depending on how often the appliance is used. Clean the filter either by hand or in the dishwasher. Take care not to bend the filters during washing.
- ▶ If by hand washing, soak the filters in warm detergent solution (approx. 40°C) to simplify the removal of grease. Brush the filters, rinse thoroughly and leave it to dry before refitting.
- ▶ If by dishwasher, select an appropriate wash program. Leave it to dry before refitting. Note: a slight discolouration of the filter may occur.
- ▶ Clean the housing for the grease filters by hand only, using warm detergent solution.
- ▶ Removing and inserting the grease filters, please see diagram.
- Insert the bottom of the grease filter into the neck of bottom cover and hold the filter by both hands.
- Press the lock and pull it downward, release the hands and feel the “click sound”. Remove in the reverse step.

Charcoal Filter (where applicable) (Fig. 11)

- ▶ The charcoal filters should be replaced when you see the orange indicator light lights up on the control panel display window or if it is noticeably dirty or discoloured, usually after 2 months depending on the conditions of use.
- ▶ These filters are not washable and cannot be restored. To ensure that this appliance functions effectively, regular maintenance is necessary as clogged filters restrict airflow and may cause the motor to overheat.
- ▶ Removing and inserting the charcoal filter, please see diagram.
- Remove the grease filter.
- Remove the saturated charcoal filter from the housing as shown. Turn the charcoal filter anti clockwise and pull down.
- Reverse the procedure when refitting the new charcoal filters.

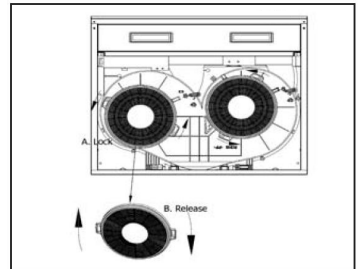

Cleaning the Appliance Body

- ▶ Clean the extractor hood using warm detergent solution and a soft damp cloth. After cleaning, dry it using a lint-free cloth.
- ▶ Avoid using corrosive or abrasive products that could damage the surface.

Replacing the lamp (Fig. 12)

- ⚠ Ensure that the appliance is disconnected from the main power supply. Note: Replace the lamp with another which has the same characteristics as a higher voltage lamp could damage the electrical unit.
- ▶ Remove grease filters and push out the lamp.
- ▶ Disconnect the wire connector from the terminal.
- ▶ Replace damaged lamps and reconnect to terminal.
- ▶ Reverse the procedure for refitting.

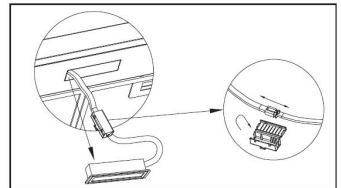

 If the decorative lights has malfunction, please do not attempt to change it yourself, please contact your local Rinnai Customer Care Center for any replacement.

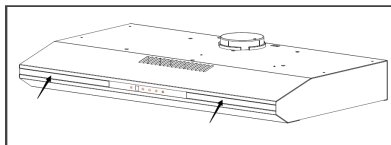

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Appliance does not function	▶ No electrical supply	▶ Check that plug is connected and main power switch is turned on
Poor airflow	▶ Grease filters might be clogged with grease build-up ▶ Charcoal filters might be clogged with grease build-up	▶ Clean the grease filters and refit when dry ▶ Replace charcoal filters with new sets
Motor is running but no airflow	▶ Non return valve might be jammed	▶ Please contact Rinnai After Sales Service
Hood suction is not effective	▶ Inadequate ventilation ▶ Charcoal filter are not installed	▶ Ensure that the kitchen is sufficiently ventilated to allow entry of fresh air ▶ Install charcoal filters for setting in recirculation mode
Whirring sound	▶ Foreign object may be in contact with fan blade	▶ Please contact Rinnai After Sales Service
Lightings are not working	▶ Lamps are burnt out ▶ Lamp connection are loose	▶ Replace the lamps ▶ Reset the connection

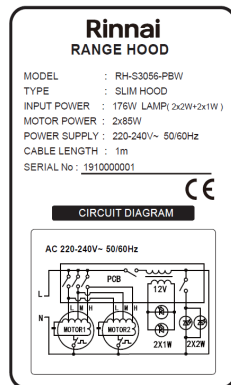
